


Fig 1: Silver nano samples (meliodent eco)




Fig 2: Control group samples (meliodent eco)




Fig 4: Water bath with thermometer to maintain temperature




Fig 1: Silver nano samples (meliodent eco)




Fig 2: Control group samples (meliodent eco)




Fig 4: Water bath with thermometer to maintain temperature




Fig: 2 Tooth shade selection with intraoral scanner using TRIOS Scanner

Journey began on March 4th by Malaysian airlines and reached KL in the evening. We reached the university campus by a van and were received by Mr.Izat, Programme coordinator and Dr Jacob John near the college accommodation allotted to us.

Programme started on 5th morning, an official photograph of the entire team was taken by Mr Izat. The students were issued log books to enter the cases they observe or assist. Students were split into two groups based on their interests, each comprising of seven students. One group was sent to the Department of Restorative Dentistryand the other to the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. An introduction was given in each department and the students were allowed to observe cases. OP hours were from (.00AM to 5.00PM with a break of one hour for lunch. They have an alarm system where they stop working by 4 Pm when the first bell is rung, start cleaning up by 4.30 PM and wind up by 5 PM. Inthe evening a trip to the KL towers was arranged.

On the second day 6thMarch, a meeting was organised by the Dean in the board room at the University of Malaya at 11.00 AM. The meeting was presided over by the Deputy Dean of Postgraduate studies, faculty of Dentistry, UM, Dr Norsiah Yunus. Dr Firdaus Hariri, Dr Shan, Dr Jacob John, Dr Anand and Mr Izat andDeputy Dean of research, Dr Zamri Radzi and other members of the research committee represented, University of Malaya. Dr.C.J.Venkatakrishnan and Dr.S. Jimson represented Tagore Dental College and Hospital. A presentation was done by Dr.Norsiah Yunus wherein the facilities, research lab, clinics, medical college, faculty and student exchange programme was discussed.
