28.07.2021 - 30.07.2021 - Oral Health Awareness Campaign

The Department of Periodontics, Tagore Dental College organized an awareness camp for public on oral hygiene for residents of surrounding villages – Alapakkam, Sadhanandapuram, Nedunkundram, Vengadamangalam and Rathinamangalam. The event was focused on informing the people about good oral hygiene practices and free hand scaling camp organized at Tagore Dental College through the first week of August.

The interns were divided into three groups and went to the various villages to interact with the public and handed out pamphlets in English and Tamil languages illustrating the importance of good oral hygiene and describing proper oral hygiene practices.
