Cancer is one of the leading causes of morbidity and mortality worldwide with approximately 14 million new cases and it is the second leading cause of death globally which is responsible for 9.6 million deaths in 2018

Around one third of deaths from cancer are due to the 5 leading behavioral and dietary risks such as high body mass index, low fruit and vegetable intake, lack of physical activity, tobacco use and alcohol use. These risk factors are easily modifiable by creating awareness.

Cancer can be prevented and controlled by implementing evidence-based strategies for cancer prevention, screening and early detection, treatment and palliative care.

The world cancer day was observed across the world on **February 4**, with an aim to unite the world's population in the fight against cancer and to save millions of preventable deaths by raising awareness and education about the disease, pressing governments and individuals across the world to take action.
